





"You didn't create yourself, so you can't tell yourself what you are created for"







You were made BY God FOR God

Day 3: What drives you in life?

- Guilt
- Anger and Resentment
- Fear
- Materialism
- Approval



Guilt

- Regretting and hiding shame
- Manipulating Memories, Controlling the future
- "We are products of our past but we do not have to be prisoners for it."
- Examples: Peter and Judas and felt into guilt, one broke for a while and came back, one ran away and had guilt
- Verse: "What happiness for those who guilt has been forgiven!... What relief for those who have confessed their sins and God has cleared their record." (Psalm 32:1-2)
- Main Point: God Is a specialist in giving people a fresh start!



Anger and Resentment



- People can hold onto, which hurts and gets over them
- Rehearse over and over in their minds
- Some internalize the anger, while some blow up and explode on others
- All are unhealthy and unhelpful
- Take onto the inside, you will continue to stew the pain
- We are just holding our anger against others and not others holding against us.
- Verse: "To worry yourself to death with resentment would be a foolish, senseless thing to do." (Job 5:2)
- Main Point: Our past is our past, nothing will change it and hold it is only hurting yourself.

Fear

- Result of Traumatic Experience, Unrealistic Expectations
- Fear Driven people miss great opportunities because they are afraid
- "Play it safe" and avoiding the risks
- Will keep you from becoming what God intends for you to be.
- Must move against it with the weapons of faith and love
- Main Point: We must not let fear conquer us!


Materialism

- Always wanting more based on misconceptions
- Having More is not happy or important but all untrue
- Possessions are only temporary happiness
- Our value is is not determined by our valuables
- A most common myth is more money will make yourself secure
- Main Point: Real security is only found with a relationship with God.

WE FIX OUR EYES NOT ON WHAT IS SEEN, BUT ON WHAT IS UNSEEN, SINCE WHAT IS SEEN IS TEMPORARY, BUT WHAT IS UNSEEN IS ETERNAL 2 Corinthians 4:18

Approval

- Allowing expectations of parents and others controlling us
- Some **are** still trying to earn their approval.
- Some are driven by peer pressure
- Some **are** always worried about others' thoughts
- Main Point: Those who follow the crowd usually get lost in it.



Knowing your purpose in life

Knowing your purpose in life gives a **Meaning** in life

- A man once said "I feel like a failure because I am struggling to become something and I don't even know what it is. All he knows how to do is to get by. Someday if he discovers his purpose, he'll feel he's beginning to live."
- Without God, life has no purpose
- No meaning, no significance or hope in life
- Examples: Isaiah had complained "I have labored to no purpose, I have spent my strength in vain and for nothing."
- Job said "My life drags by day after hopeless day. I give up.
 I am tired of living, Leave me alone. My life makes no sense."



Knowing your purpose in life **Simplifies** life

- Define what to do and not do
- Ask ourselves "Does this activity help me fulfill one of God's purposes for my life?"
- We tend to make choices based on circumstances, pressure or mood.
- It is impossible to do everything people want us to do.
- But enough time to do God's will



Knowing your purpose in life gives a **Focus** in life

- Concentrating effort and energy on what is important
- Some spin around and keep changing directions



- The Bible said, "Don't live carelessly, unthinkingly. Make sure you understand what the Master wants." (Ephesians 5:17)
- **Example:** Paul single handedly spread Christianity throughout the Roman Empire
- "He focused all his energies on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forwards to what lied ahead."
- Paul said, "Let's keep focused on that goals, those of us who want everything God has for us."
- Never confuse activity with productivity

Knowing your purpose in life gives a **Motivates** life

- Always producing passion
- Nothing energizes like a clear purpose
- But passion dissipates when you lack that purpose




Knowing your purpose in life **Prepares** you for eternity.

- Many spend their lives trying to create a legacy on earth
- But what ultimately matters most will not be what other say about your life but what God says.
- People tend to fail to realize that these achievements will be gone.
- Example: One student's goal in college was to become the school's tennis champion, feeling proud when his trophy was then placed in the cabinet. Years later, someone mailed him saying they found it in the trash. The student said "Give enough time, all your trophies will be trashed by someone else!"
- A wiser use of time is to build an eternal legacy.
- Main Point: We were not put on earth to be remembered, but to prepare for eternity.

SO REMEMBER YOUR CREATOR IN THE DAYS OF YOUR YOUTH: BEFORE THE DAYS OF ADVERSITY COME, AND THE YEARS APPROACH WHEN YOU WILL SAY, "I HAVE NO DELIGHT IN THEM"; BEFORE THE SUN AND THE LIGHT ARE DARKENED, AND THE MOON AND THE STARS, AND THE CLOUDS RETURN AFTER THE RAIN; ECCLESIASTES 12:1-2

Day 4: Made to Last Forever

- The life we have now is not what there all is.
- It is preparation for the next
- May live 100 years on earth, but forever in eternity
- One Day, it will be the end of our body on earth but not for our soul
- Our relationship with God determines the future for eternity
- Once you determine life is preparation, you will live differently
- All goals will seem unworthy, priorities reordered






Preparation for Eternity

YOUR FUTURE WITH GOD IS INFINITELY GREATER THAN ALL THAT TRAILS BEHIND YOU.

- Compare this to for say a rehearsal of a play is our lives now and the play is the eternal life.
- Or even the nine month in your mother's womb was preparation for life here, but life now is preparation for eternity.
- Today is the visible tip of the iceberg, eternity is the rest underneath the surface.
- We can also compare this as life on earth is the cover of a book and eternity is the chapter that no one has read yet, Chapter One.
- "I once thought all these things were so very important, but now I consider them worthless because of what Christ has done."
- We should ensure our actions relate to eternity.
