The quality of being **faithful** in your **support** of someone or something.


Joshua Overview

- After 40 years in the wilderness
- Spying on Jericho
- Crossing the Jordan



Conquering the Enemy (6 – 12)



- Battle of AI
- Defeated the 5 kings of the Amorites



Dividing the Land (13 – 24)

- 12 Tribes of Israel
- Final words of Joshua:
 "Choose this day whom you will serve"

What can we learn about Christ and the Church?

"Be strong and of good courage, for to this people you shall divide as an inheritance the land which I swore to their fathers to give them"

- Joshua 1:6

"Be strong and very courageous, that you may observe to do according to all the law which Moses My servant commanded you; do not turn from it to the right hand or to the left, that you may prosper wherever you go"

- Joshua 1:7

"Be strong and of good courage, do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go"

- Joshua 1:9



Success of our Themes experienced in Joshua

Faith

• Rahab: "For we have **Heard** how the Lord dried up the water of the Red Sea **for you**" (2:10)

Loyalty

- Are you for God? (Angel of the Lord 5:15)
- Choose this day whom you will serve (24:15)

Dedication

• 12 stones – "a sign when children ask what do these stones mean? (4:6)"

Obedience

• Walls of Jericho vs Battle of AI



Judges Overview

Judges: Leaders who by the Spirit of God were given authority to govern and deliver

- Ch.1-2: Tribes and Summary
- Ch. 3-16: Stories of Judges
- Ch. 17-21: Corruption of Israel



What can we learn about Christ and the Church?

"In those days there was no king in Israel; Everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (17:6, 18:1, 19:1, 21:25)

- The absence of God: turning away from God = Israel's destruction
 - We need God's grace
- "God's Spirit" empowers even the weak, does not endorse bad decisions:
 - **Gideon:** Built an ephod (took credit) + had Abimelech from a concubine
 - **Jephthah:** Son of a harlot. Doesn't know God's character and offers his daughter.
 - Samson: Tricked by two different women and enticed by another in between
- We are not of this world

Failure of our Themes experienced in Judges

Faith

• Lacking from Gideon

Loyalty

Lacking in Samson and Delilah

Dedication

• Jephthah wrongfully sacrificing his daughter

Obedience

• The Israelites would worship idols repeatedly



Ruth Overview

Ch 1: Tragedy and Death

- Naomi's husband and two sons are dead
- Ruth stays with her mother-in-law and Orpah leaves them
- Ruth & Naomi return toBethlehem

Ch 2: Hope

- Ruth meets Boaz –
 a relative to Naomi
- Boaz makes provision to Ruth and her family
- Boaz is the family redeemer

Ch 3: Boldness

- Ruth is no longer dressing as a widow
- Ruth approaches
 Boaz with her
 intentions of
 marriage
- Boaz agreed but only legally

Ch 4: Reversal of the Tragedies

- A closer relative declines to marry Ruth
- Ruth and Boaz are wed and she gives birth to a new son
- Her descendant is King David and eventually Christ



What can we learn about Christ and the Church?

- God is not mentioned in the story his hand is invisible
- Naomi is bitter but God is actually trying to restore her family:
 - We don't always understand God's plan
 - We should not abandon our faith amidst challenging times
- God is does this through Ruth's loyalty and Boaz' integrity:
 - Ruth is loyal to Naomi as the Church is loyal to it's people and to Christ
 - Boaz redeems their family as Christ redeemed us

Success of our Themes experienced in Ruth

Faith

• Naomi and Ruth have faith in Boaz as the family redeemer

Loyalty

• Ruth to Naomi – Where you go I will go, your people = my people, your God = my God

Dedication

• Boaz is dedicated to redeeming Ruth's family

Obedience

 Ruth obeys Naomi and presents herself available for marriage to Boaz
