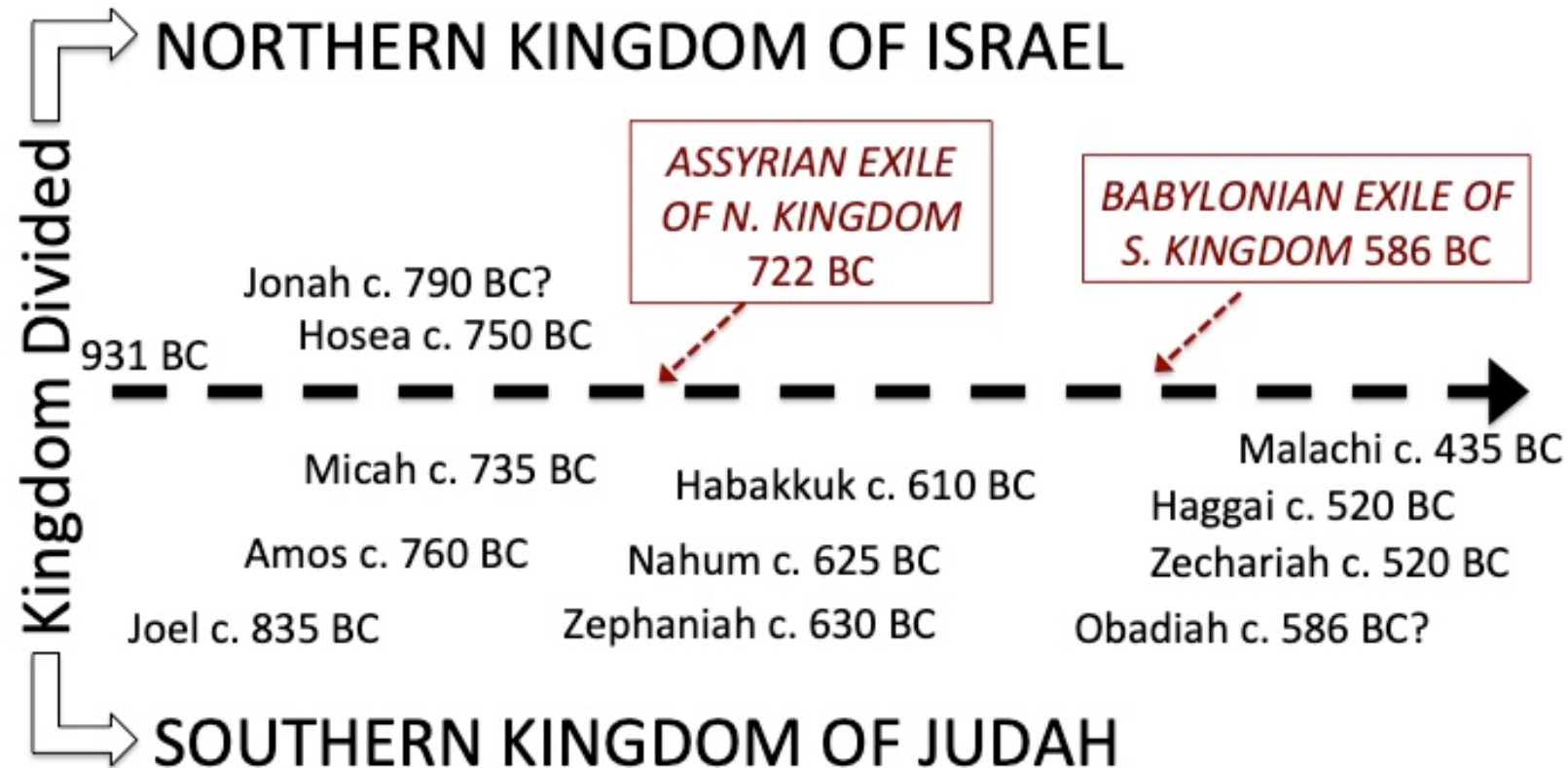

What happens in the story of Habakkuk?

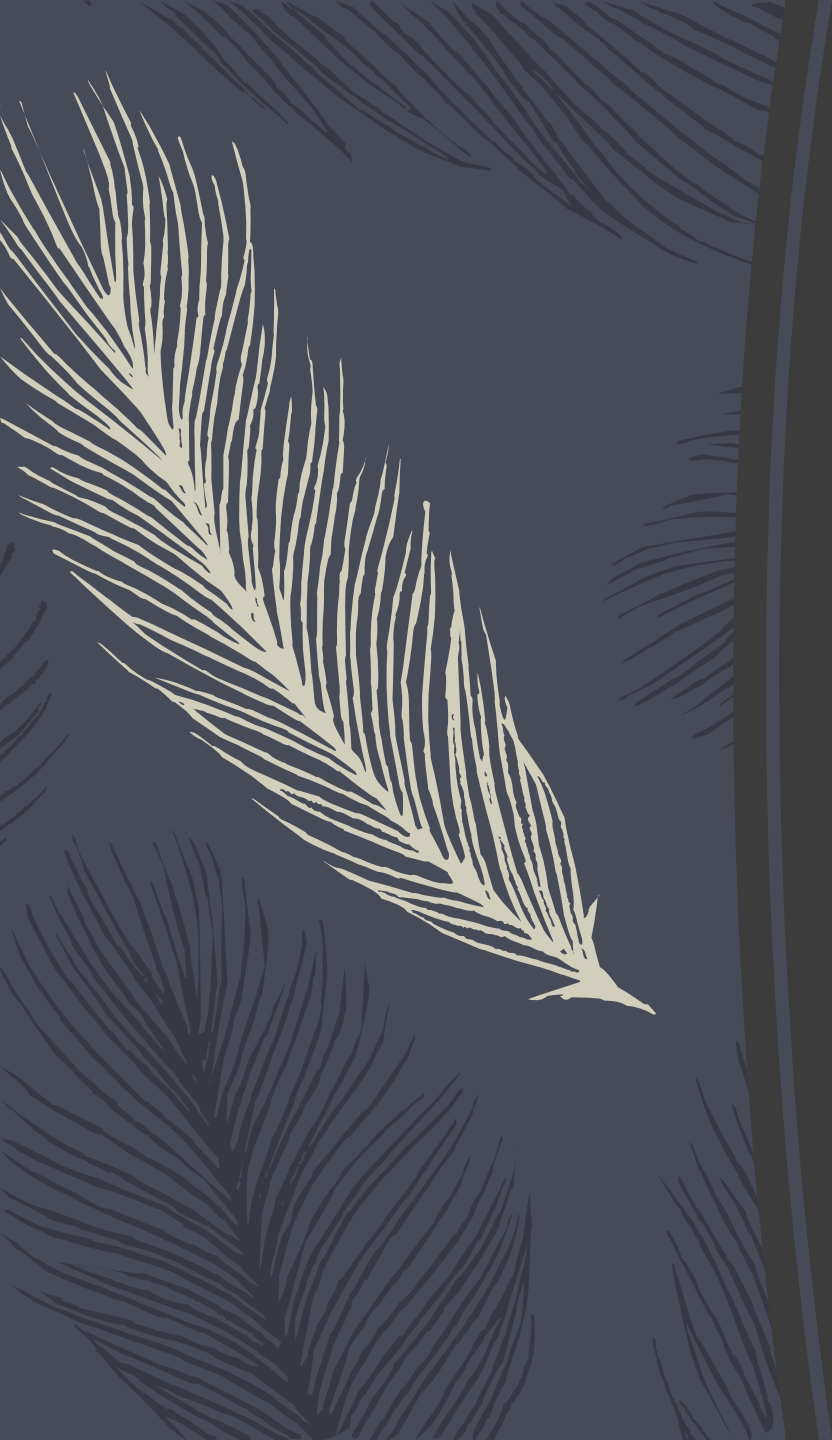




What does this mean for
