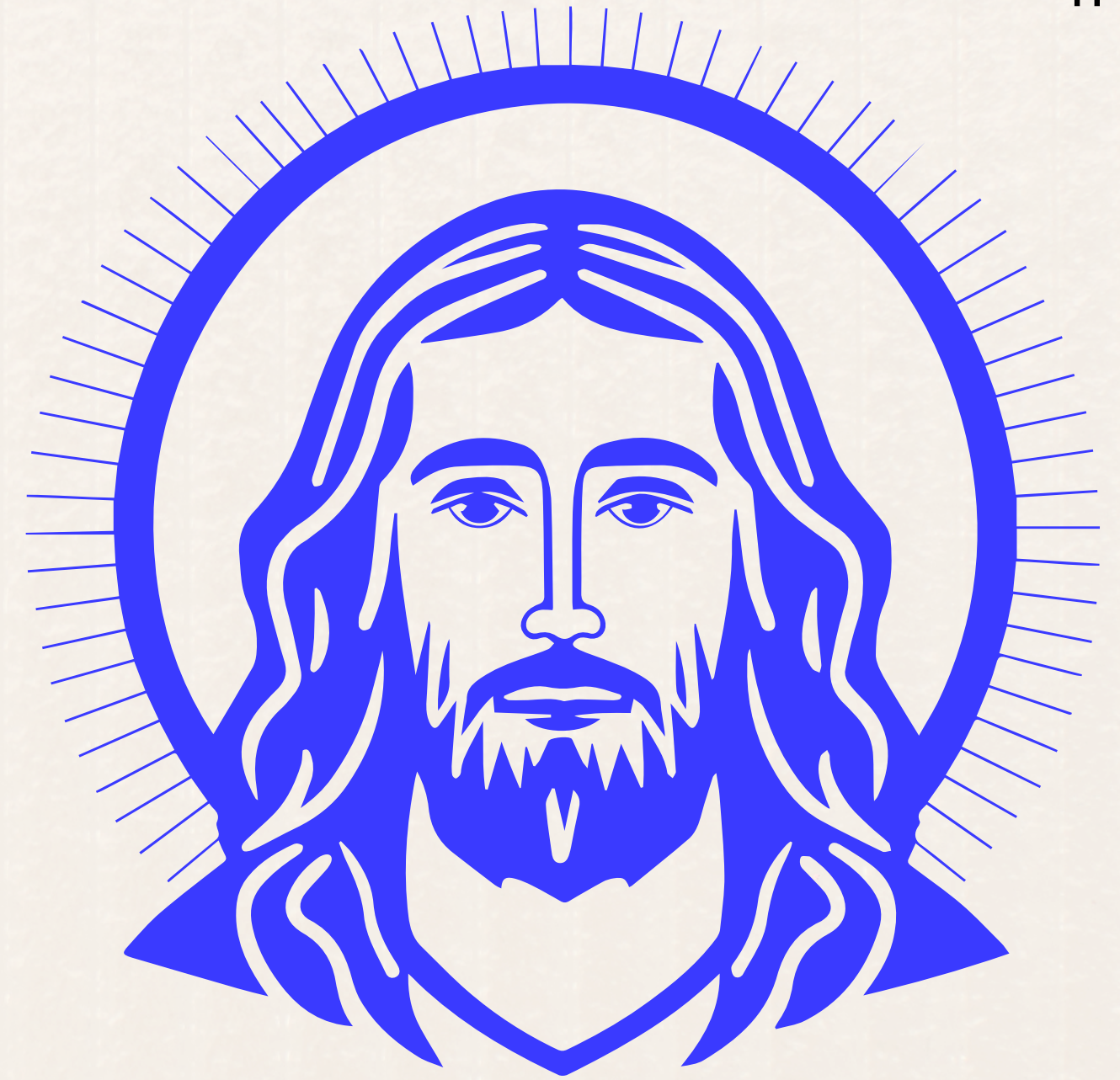

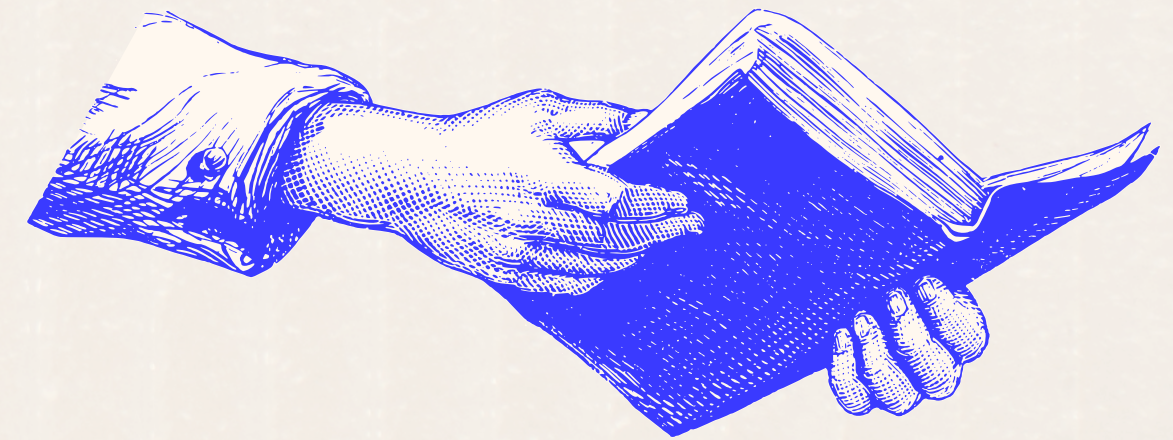

Relational Verification of God

- We all experience certain emotions, but there is no scientific method to detect them.
 - For example, **love is not physical matter. But it exists and is accepted as a reality**
- This same concept applies to our knowledge of God. He is not physical material.
- Many individuals experience God in a personal way, and when they get to know God, it impacts their lives positively.
- Christians do acts of kindness due to their relationship with God. It motivates them to express their love practically.

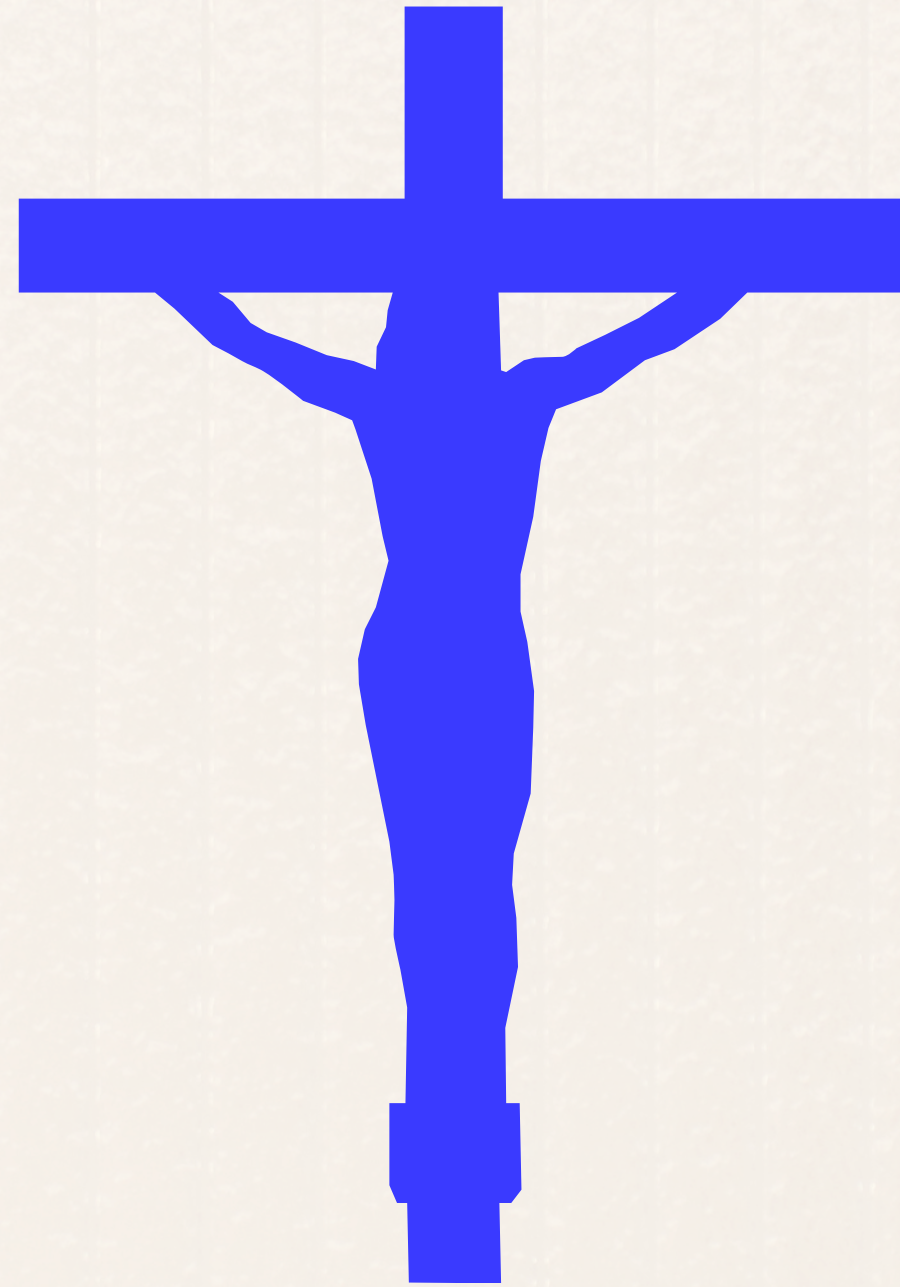
The Law of Cause & Effect

Believe	Infinite reward (Heaven)	Finite loss (Missed opportunities)
Don't Believe	Infinite loss (Hell)	Finite gain (Free lifestyle)

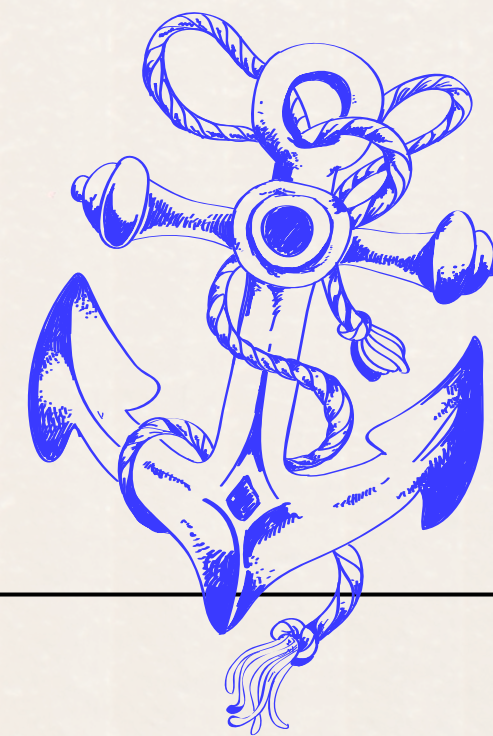
How does the proof about God's existance help us in our spiritual or personal lives or in service?

Pope Shenouda always used to say, "Rubbena Mawgood"... meaning "God is present" or "God exists" as a reminder of encouragement.

Conclusion

- Scientifically, God is the inference to the best explanation. Logical reasoning and personal experience provide strong rationales for belief in God.
