- ☐ On what basis would reward be given to the elect if they had no choice in their destiny?
- ☐ Why would God punish a person predestined to perdition?







# WILL

“I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing; therefore **choose** life.”  
(Deuteronomy 30:19)

...**elect** according to the  
foreknowledge of God .... (1 Peter 1:1-2)  
whom He foreknew, He also **predestined...**  
(Romans 8:29)

The future does not flow from foreknowledge, but foreknowledge comes from what you do in the future

God foreknew that Judas was going to betray Jesus of his own free will. But God's foreknowledge did not force Judas to betray Jesus.

# WILL VS. FOREKNOWLEDGE

- God's predestination for salvation is **not due to His will** (God wants all to be saved- His will is that all should be saved)
- God's predestination for salvation is due to His divine foreknowledge, "Whom He foreknew, He also
- predestined".
- The same is clear from the words of St. Peter, "**elect according to the foreknowledge** of God" (1Pet 1:2)
- [NOT FOREKNOWLEDGE ACCORDING TO HIS WILL].
- The key point is to differentiate between **God's will** and **His foreknowledge**.


**FREE TO CHOOSE!**

YOU ARE ALWAYS FREE TO CHOOSE

“I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing; therefore **choose** life.” (Deuteronomy 30:19)

- \* God knows beforehand if you will repent or not and he knows if you will go to heaven or not.
- \* Even though He already knows your destiny, He does not compel your choice and you are always free to choose and to struggle.
- \* Even though He knows what your choice will be, you are 1000% free to choose. He desires that we all repent and turn to Christ and be saved.

\* **Satellite View (God's Perspective):** From God's perspective (the "satellite view"), everything is known simultaneously because God exists outside of time. He has a complete and perfect overview of all events and all human choices, from all eternity. This divine foreknowledge does not cause or compel human actions; it simply observes what will freely happen.




\* **Street View (Human Perspective):** Humans experience life sequentially, from the "street view." We are not aware of the future and must make free choices at every turn, navigating our path in real time. Our will is genuinely free, a gift from God, and our choices have real consequences for our salvation.






\* God knows the outcome because He foresees our free choices, not because He has predetermined them.



\* The "street view" is where real, free decisions are made, and the "satellite view" is God's timeless awareness of all those decisions.



And because we repent, He has ordained/prepared a glorious future for us based on our free will response to His offer of Salvation.

He knows our choice.

Based on our choice, he has predestined us for glory.



You are FREE to choose to do God's will.

You are FREE to choose to serve faithfully

You are FREE to work hard in service

Cursed *is* he who does the work of the LORD deceitfully (haphazardly)

-Jeremiah 48:10

You are FREE to build up treasures in heaven through your service.

He knows our choice. Based on our choice, he has predestined you for glory.

*“[Our Lord] Jesus said, ‘Come to me all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.’ He calls everyone to himself, and no one is lacking in the grace of this calling, for when he says ‘everyone’ he excludes nobody.”*

*But those whom he long ago foresaw would come into being he predestined to participate in the future blessings and called them to receive justification by faith in Him and not to sin again.”*

\*Predestination “does not take away our free will.” Romans 8:29 “uses the word ‘foreknew’ before ‘predestined’.

\*Now it is clear that “foreknowledge” does **not** by itself **impose** any particular kind of behavior...”

- Diodorus of Tarsus

*\* if the word of God foretells that some angels and men shall be certainly punished, it did so because it foreknew that they would be unchangeably [wicked], but not because God had created them so. So that if they repent, all who wish for it can obtain mercy from God. ([Dialogue with Typho](#), ch. 141)*

*\* St. Justin Martyr (2<sup>nd</sup> C.)*

*For those who live in unrepenting sin or laziness or lack of service, a saint of the Eastern Orthodox Church once said,*

*“Yes, indeed, [God] truly knew you beforehand as inattentive and disobedient and lazy, but this is certainly not because He ordered or foreordained it that you should have no power to repent to get up and obey ...*

*“”Those who are going to repent’, you say, ‘were predestined, but I am not one of them. So, let them repent therefore whom God clearly foreknew, and whom He also predestined.’”*

*“O shamelessness of soul and worse than the demons themselves! When did anyone ever hear of one of them saying such a thing? Where was it ever heard that a demon **blamed God for its own damnation?***

Predestination based on God's foreknowledge can not be used to blame God for bad deeds or damnation

ALSO, it should not be used to assume that you don't need to do anything, don't serve, don't repent, don't do good deeds since I'm already "predestined" This is **DEAD FAITH** (James 2:17)
